

M.A. DEGREE REQUIREMENTS
Literature Track, *Thesis Option*
(36 semester hours)

The thesis option is recommended for students who want the experience of research and writing for an extended period of time (at least two-three semesters) on a focused question or problem. Although some doctoral programs value applicants who have completed a thesis, others prefer students with the broader knowledge that additional course work provides.

I. Required Core Courses for all English MA Students (6 semester hours)

1. ENG 500 – The Discipline of English Studies
2. ENG 501 – Critical Theory

II. Required Courses for Literature Track, thesis option (15 semester hours)

1. One course in literature before 1660
2. One course in literature between 1660 and 1900
3. One course in literature between 1900 and the present
4. ENG 550, History, Form and Ideology
5. ENG 560, Locating Literature

III. Electives (9 semester hours)

Students are to select two electives from among courses in the following categories: General Topics and Theory, English Literature, American Literature, Comparative Literature, Composition and Rhetoric, and Research and Special Topics. For course categories, see the *Graduate Catalog* or *Handbook for English Graduate Students*.

Students are to select one free elective chosen from among all ENG categories, including those listed in the paragraph above and in the categories of Language, Teaching Skills, Creative Writing, and PWP (West Chester Writing Project) courses.

IV. Required Capstone Experience (6 semester hours)

ENG 614, Capstone Writing and Research Seminar
ENG 620, M.A. Essay (thesis)

V. Additional Requirements

American literature requirement: At least one course must be taken in American literature. Although it is not limited to these, “American literature” includes courses in the literature of various populations that contribute to the diversity of U.S. culture: African-American, Native American, and Asian American, among others.

Non-canonical requirement: At least one course must be taken in a topic addressing writing, literature, and/or pedagogy relating to under-represented groups.

ENG 614 is to be taken prior to ENG 620.
