Building a strong online education community

By partnering with our dedicated faculty, administrators, and staff, digital learning continues to grow at West Chester University. Over the past year, we have seen another two-digit growth rate on distance education enrollment and course offerings. Additionally, we have started to extend our instructional design and technology integration services to faculty who teach face-to-face courses. Digital learning is not limited to distance education; it applies to all!

Not only has Distance Education grown on campus, so has our department. We have grown from just 2 employees in 2011 to now 9 employees! We have a staff of 4 Instructional Designers, 2 Online Support Specialists and 1 Learning Technologist to keep up with the ongoing growth of Distance Education programs and courses.



Social Media has become a big part of how we stay in touch with our students. We post instructional videos, various contests, and campus news to our social media accounts. This year we reached 6,746 people on our Facebook page and had 34,125 tweet expressions on Twitter!



Our 4th Annual Teaching with Technology Excellence Showcase & Award allows faculty to share how they use certain online tools in their classrooms.




The goal of our 1st annual GAAD was to get everyone talking, thinking and learning about digital access/inclusion and people with different disabilities






There was a **12% increase** from the 2016-2017 academic year in online student seats.




Initiatives

eTextbook Initiative

This initiative is a University-wide effort funded by Information Services & Technology that aims to address the following objectives:

- Improve access to educational materials
- Save students money by replacing high-cost print and electronic textbooks
- Develop faculty competencies on technological tools needed to create eTextbooks and content for eTextbooks.



Constance Case wrote and designed an eTextbook for her Theater class, "Costume Construction, Basic Theatrical Sewing Techniques." Her students are using the eTextbook for the first time this Fall 2018 semester.



6 WCU Faculty Members participated in the 2017-2018 eTextbook initiative, and many plan to release their books during the 2018-2019 academic year!



Quality Matters Initiative

The Quality Matters initiative is a University-wide effort funded by IS&T Distance Education Services that aims to promote online course quality and teaching effectiveness. Quality Matters (QM) is a nationally recognized organization. It offers a set of online course design standards and program review criteria through a rigorous review process.

13 WCU Faculty successfully completed the training and became QM Peer Reviewers during the 2017-2018 fiscal year!



DE Access Fee Initiative

This initiative is a University-wide effort funded by the Distance Education Access Fee that aims to foster technology innovation and teaching effectiveness in online and blended courses. The projects address one of the following:

- Developing new blended/online programs
- implementing e-learning technologies
- implementing and assessing new pedagogies
- Developing faculty competencies on e-learning technology tools that are used in online or face-to-face classrooms at WCU.

Online Faculty Development

One-Button Studio

IS&T Distance Education Services launched the One-Button Studio during the Spring 2018 semester. The studio allows you to create a high-quality video recording without having to be an expert in lighting, audio, and video equipment.

Simply insert a flash drive and press a button to record yourself either with or without a slideshow or in front of a green screen.




Self-Paced Training

Faculty can participate in 100% online, self-paced workshops that guide them towards becoming an expert user of different technology tools. Trainings vary by semester and you can sign up at any time. This past year, the instructional designers facilitated trainings on Camtasia and VoiceThread.



NODE

Network of Distance Educators (NODE) is a voluntary program that helps WCU faculty create connections across campus, and to share ideas and teaching strategies. Participants "opt-in" to a 30-minute call as their schedules permit. Conversations occur on Fridays through a simple video conference tool. Any individual who teaches at West Chester University is eligible to participate.

The Support Specialists of Distance Education Service's created and posted bi-weekly "How-to" videos to Distance Education Service's YouTube channel. The How-to topics included:





Where are our students from?

West Chester University is a part of the State Authorization Reciprocity Agreement (SARA). This is an agreement among member states, districts and territories that establishes comparable national standards for interstate offering of post secondary distance education courses and programs. Participation in SARA allows WCU to offer online courses to students residing in any of the 50 SARA states/territories. These students were also able to complete field experience, internships, and clinical placements in their home state.

Over a thousand of our online students are from Pennsylvania, while most others are from the surrounding states including New Jersey, Delaware, and Maryland. We have 6 students all the way in California and even 9 in Texas. The map below indicates where our online student from the 2017-2018 academic year were located.
