

THE MASTER OF SCIENCE IN PSYCHOLOGY (GENERAL)

The M.S. in General Psychology program at WCU is designed for students interested in research and/or teaching, and prepares graduates for training at the doctoral level. Our 36-credit program is limited to a small cohort of students each year. Our accepted students come to the program with specifically defined educational plans, including career advancement, preparation for study in a doctoral program, or exploration of the field for those who may have a limited background in psychology. Students gain an understanding of research design and experience, the different areas of psychology, data analysis, and psychological measurement.



ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

A complete application to the Master of Science in Psychology (General) program consists of the following:

- 1. Completed application
- 2. Official transcripts from all institutions of higher education
- 3. Minimum GPA of 3.0 in college coursework and a GPA of 3.25 in Psychology classes
- 4. Applicants who were not Psychology majors may be required to complete undergraduate Psychology courses as a condition of admission to a program or as a condition for approval to Degree Candidacy.
- 5. Three letters of recommendation are required.
- 6. A personal goals statement is required.
