- FERPA** (more this afternoon)
- Access to student grades and attendance information
- Ability to schedule to meet with students
- Create students' schedukes
- Contact with students' professors
- Respond to parents' calls with information about specific students

## HOW PARENTS CAN HELP.

- Advisor assignments are made in August.
- REMEMBER - a major is NOT a career.
